Caroline has been a frequent visitor at House of Hope since February when the club officially launched, attending playgroups and the tutoring sessions weekly, and helping with many family events. She brought an army of eager and enthusiastic UML undergrads with her. Her efforts increased the capacity, quality, and impact of play and education at House of Hope.

The UML Students provided about 50 percent of volunteer attendance this Spring, which averaged 15 volunteers doing 32 site visits with 57 volunteer hours per month!

FY24 HOME PLACEMENTS!

Our fiscal year starts on July 1 every year. So by early June, we have just about completed another whole year. Our Case Managers and Housing Advocates have been working hard assisting families with removing barriers to obtaining permanent housing. They have spent many hours connecting with landlords and property managers, assisting with applications, attending apartment viewings, helping complete all necessary paperwork for new lease ups, and advocating for our families. Many of the families in shelter have a primary language other than English; therefore, our workers also spend time translating for all of this to happen. Since July 1, 2023 we have assisted 31 families with moving into their new apartments from shelter!

This number (31 families) includes a single father with six children and a single mom with a young daughter who has fought hard to start a new life for her little

family. Many of the families were accepted into low-income, subsidized housing projects. Fifteen of these families have moved into apartments within the Merrimack Valley region and our Housing Advocates also provide stabilization services to these families for at least two years. This includes visits, phone calls, advocacy and support with referrals, Rosa and Daughter w-Housing Advocate Lisa etc. The purpose of this service is to assist families, many of whom are renting an and insuring housing success.

House of Hope Housing provides supportive, low-income housing at five different sites in Lowell (totaling 39 apartments- 2-bedroom, 3-bedroom, and 4-bedroom apartments). Since July 1, 2023, 6 families moved out of these apartments. HOH was able to screen and approve 6 families from shelter to lease up in these housing units! These six families are provided with beautiful apartments with affordable rent and continue to receive support services from House of Hope's Housing Advocates.

YOUTH SERVICES **NEWS!**

This Spring, our Community Services Assistant, Pam Larocque, delivered on average 37 playgroups, reaching a total of 32 kids and many of them multiple times across all playgroups each month. There were 54 hours of play delivered monthly, as well. At our

Fletcher Street Shelter, structured play-groups were regularly delivered about 4 days per week in the late afternoon and/or in the evening following dinner. Pam has also been playing at our smaller "Hope 2 Opportunity" Shelter on Wednesday evenings with a lot of success; the groups are smaller there, but children and parents are active and participatory. Pam's playgroups have a capacity for 5 children, and the capacity increases depending on the number of volunteers. Afternoon Toddler Groups at Fletcher have also been highly rewarding and Pam continues to deliver them 2-3 days weekly. In the evenings with older children, playgroups included seasonal activities such as Spring Flower Lap Books and Zoo Animal Crafts. HOH has partnered with School on Wheels for the opportunity to provide professional quality tutoring services to the young residents at House of Hope.



HOH was also excited to welcome the Pollard Memorial Library's Bookmobile for several visits. Staff from the Pollard arrived with the Bookmobile and all of its treasures on a beautiful May Afternoon and June Morning to share in a picnic with residents at the Fletcher Street Shelter Site. Eighteen families received library cards, and they checked out books immediately. Parents learned about library and community resources during the summer months. A Fletcher Street Dad also taught a few kids how to play soccer during the Pollard Picnic. House of Hope looks forward to a summer of sun, fun, and learning with our new friends at the Pollard Memorial Library.
